Susan Overman welcomed the group to Ochsner, thanked Mike Waguespack from Quick Clot for the dinner, and introduced the speaker for the CE presentation.

Continuing Education Program: AAMI Levels and Surgical Gowns: Know if You're Protected

Presented by: Angela Maxwell (Cardinal Health)

Safety is the #1goal in the OR. Choosing the right gown for the right procedure is essential for both the safety of the patient and perioperative staff members. She provided enlightening information about the testing of gowns for the different levels of protection.

The standards and guidelines for surgical gowns are established by a variety of governmental and professional organizations. One such standard is the ANSI/AAMI PB70 on Liquid Barrier Performance and Classification Protective Apparel and Drapes. Four levels of protection are described along with the level of testing that each level must achieve. Levels 1 provides the least protection; Level 4 provides the greatest protection.

Gown selection criteria includes: barrier effectiveness, abrasion resistance, strength, comfort, flammability, lint generation, toxicity.


