

Delegate Information/Willingness-to-Serve Form

page 1

Delegates shall represent the local Chapter at the annual National Conference meetings. The Chapter is entitled to elect at least one delegate and one alternate, based on total active membership. The alternate delegate has the same responsibilities as the delegate. An alternate delegate is one who shall be seated in the delegate section only in the absence of the delegate. Once an alternate has been moved up to delegate status, the status is maintained for the duration of the Conference. Total delegate numbers are determined by our National Association.

Election of Delegates - Eligibility

- 1. A delegate and alternate delegate must be a current member of AORN. Delegates are chosen on a point system.
- 2. A delegate and alternate delegate should have attended at least six (6) general meetings the previous year, based on ten (10) meetings a year.
- 3. A delegate and alternate delegate must have active participation on a local AORN committee the previous year.
- 4. The President and President-elect are automatically delegates and the President-elect shall act as Chairman of Delegates. Other eligible members must fill out a "Willingness to Serve" form on or by the designated meeting.
- 5. The number of eligible persons receiving the highest number of points will be selected as delegates and the next number of highest points will be the alternate delegate.
- 6. Eligibility requirements may be waived in lieu of insufficient candidates.

Provisions for Delegates

- 1. Delegates are required to fulfill all duties at the Conference. Failure to do so will result in the delegate returning a prorated amount of their funding to the Chapter. This amount is determined based on the number of mandatory delegate activities.
- 2. If an alternate is selected, they will be funded their Conference registration.
- 3. If the alternate needs to be seated as a delegate at the Conference, the alternate will be funded the prorated amount of the unseated delegates' funding.

Credentials

- 1. Chosen delegates/alternate must indicate their status as either delegate or alternate on their Conference registration form.
- 2. Delegates shall register at delegates' booth with the following:
- a. Current RN registration/licensure.
- b. Current AORN membership card.
- c. Official delegate authorization letter from National Headquarters.
- 3. Delegates are required to wear official badge at all business meetings of the Association.

Responsibilities

- Delegates and alternate delegate shall become familiar with and adhere to directions forwarded from National Headquarters, prior to attending the National Conference.
- Attend all business sessions and special delegate activities at the Annual National Congress.
- 3. Delegates shall seek information on all issues under discussion, and act in the best interest of the Chapter.
- 4. Delegates are encouraged to vote as recommended by the Chapter on all issues and for National Officers.
- 5. Shall relate to members from other areas and evaluate them in light of their leadership potential so that the Chapter may submit names of prospective candidates for an elected national office.
- 6. Attend educational and scientific meetings and exhibits at the National Congress.
- 7. The Delegates Chairman shall give a meaningful report to the Chapter following attendance at the National Congress, and submit a written report for publication in the Chapter newsletter.
- 8. Delegates designated to any Annual Congress shall continue in their office as delegates for the purpose of any special meeting of the National Association that may be called until the delegates are duly designated for the next Annual Congress and likewise for the local Chapter that they may be called until the delegates are duly designated for the next Congress.
- 9. Delegates must attend pre-Congress Meetings, called by the Chairman.

GUIDELINES FOR DELEGATE SELECTION

- 1. Chapter membership for a pre-determined time before Congress.
- 2. Attendance at a given number of monthly meetings for the year preceding.
- 3. Active participation in Chapter affairs, service on a committee, program participant, etc., for a year previous to selection.
- The President and President-Elect are automatically delegates.
- 5. Assignments as a delegate may be an incentive award for a member other than an officer, if that person has contributed greatly to the functioning of the Chapter.
- 6. The amount of money that is available from the treasury will determine how the Chapter funds its delegates. Funds are distributed by the Treasurer prior to Congress.
- 7. Delegates are required to fulfill all duties at Congress. Failure to do so will result in the delegate returning a prorated portion of their funding to the Chapter. This amount is determined based on the number of mandatory delegate activities.
- 8. Any delegate/(s) failing to fulfill obligation in regard to voting and attendance at meetings may not serve as delegate for one year.
- 9. Headquarters recommends points system as the only fair way to choose delegates.
